What's our focus this term?

This half-term, the children will continue their Survival topic. This second Geography-based unit will focus on the study of mountains and rivers.

Children will also continue their exploration of Shackleton's Journey and reflect on the skills needed to make a successful team player. This will prepare them for their end of year adventure trip to Runways End.

The children have worked exceedingly hard to prepare for the Year 4 Multiplication times table check. These nationwide tests will be beginning on Tuesday 7th June and will continue for 2 weeks with different children sitting the test on different days. We will then be sending your child's results home on Friday 1st

We are extremely grateful for the support parents and carers have given to help the children to prepare for the test and we cannot wait to see their results.

However, it is vital that times table practise continues after the tests to ensure children maintain their understanding to ensure they are prepared for the challenges of upper school maths.

HOMEWORK

The children have got off to a good start with their homework but please be aware that we will now be ensuring that this is always completed, as part of their preparation for upper school.

In Year 4, homework consists of a weekly Mathematics (online) and an English task (paper sheet). Both are set on a Monday and due in the following Monday.

5 'rule breakers' or tricky words will be sent home on a Monday in their spelling book and via text to practice. We also ask that you continue to practise times tables recall with your children regularly and continue to use TT Rockstars.

Finally, we ask that you ensure they are reading either a school book or a book from home at least 3 times per week and that this is recorded in their reading record and signed by an adult.
