HOMEWORK

We are so proud of the ever-improving attitude towards learning we've seen this year. The next step is to prepare for year 6.

In Year 5, homework consists of a weekly Mathematics (online) and an English task (paper sheet). Both are set on a Monday and due in the following Monday.

5 'rule breakers' or tricky words will be sent home on a Monday in their spelling book and via text to practice. We also ask that you continue to practise times tables recall with your children regularly and continue to use TT Rockstars.

Finally, we ask that you ensure they are reading either a school book or a book from home at least 3 times per week and that this is recorded in their reading record and signed by an adult.









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Have a sneak peak into some of the exciting texts we'll be reading this half-term across our core and foundation topics.

Please continue to monitor your child's use of devices, including who they are speaking to online. We have been made aware that a large number of children still to not understand the risks involved in accepting friend requests from people that they do not know online. Please continue to support us by helping your child to understand that they do not need to have these people as "friends" in order to play the game.

We have also been made aware that a significant number of children have experienced racist or misogynistic language whilst online. Whilst some children were able to articulate how to handle situations like this, a large number still disclosed that they felt upset or affected by the experience. Please help us in reiterating that they do not need to tolerate language like this.
