We are delighted to announce that this year, we will working to maintain our Platinum status. As a school, we are part of the Modeshift STARS scheme – the national schools award scheme established to recognise schools that have demonstrated excellence in supporting cycling, walking and other forms of sustainable travel.

The scheme encourages schools across the country to join in a major effort to increase levels of sustainable and active travel in order to improve the health and wellbeing of children and young people. In recent years, we have taken part in Hampshire County Council's walk to school week along with other similar initiatives such as Bike Week, Bikeability and Scooter challenges.

This year, we have taken part in several campaigns organised by Living Streets and Modeshift:

In November, we had a visit from Living Streets' mascot Strider! They taught us all about how to walk to school safely and presented us with our Platinum award.





We have appointed two JRSOs (Junior Road Safety Officers) / WOW ambassadors who have presented various assemblies, assisted in handing out badges and participated in online training from Hampshire.





We have participated in

various competitions this year: WOW: Design a Badge, WOW: Walk of Fame, Walk to school week and Walktober. Here are some of our amazing badge design entries!

We are pushing to create links with active travel through our curriculum by actively travelling to our school trips and teaching the importance of road safety alongside this. Here are Year 5, who participated in a nature walk to the Wellington Statue.



We also encourage active travel through our maths lessons! Year 5 have been analysing the percentage of student's actively travelling to school and have been looking at the data on our Travel Tracker.
